# PREPARE FOR A POSITION AS A COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER

### **COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER**

Community Health Workers (CHW) are front-line agents of change helping to reduce health disparities in undeserved communities. They can be identified by many titles, including outreach educators, community health navigators, peer health educators, community outreach advisors and contact tracers. In general, people who work in this role help others navigate often complex health care systems, in order to live healthy lives.

CHW's provide individuals with culturally appropriate information about available community resources and how to access them. They can advocate for individual and community health needs as well as provide some direct services to include first-aid and blood pressure checks. They can reach community residents where they live or in community spaces where people frequent such as in churches, community centers, schools or health facilities.

Once in the field CHW's may find opportunities to transition to social work, nursing or other health related professions.
